Remember,

Even though some words are commonly used, they can make folks feel excluded, hurt, or judged. Below is a list of exclusionary words/phrases and their inclusive alternatives. Surely, we do not intend to offend anyone, but we run the risk of offense when we are unaware of how our biases may affect our language.

"WHITE" LIE	LIE (CALLING IT WHITE DOESN'T MAKE IT OK)
PARENTS	ADULT AT HOME/GROWNUP
YOU GUYS	Y'ALL/FOLKS
BOYFRIEND/GIRLFRIEND	PARTNER/PERSON YOU'RE DATING
CHRISTMAS BREAK	WINTER BREAK
CRAZY	HECTIC/HARD/BUSY
SUMMER VACATION	TIME OFF/SUMMER BREAK
