




87% reported pro-social bonding with other girls

A Deep Dive Into Our Exciting New Evaluations!

Beginning with our summer 2019 programs, we have rolled out a new survey for use across our programs. Using best practices for assessing self-efficacy (Bandura, 2006; Pajares, Hartley, & Valiante, 2001) and our experience administering surveys to girls in our program, Program Evaluator, Sarah Miller-Fellows, developed a master question set to assess self-efficacy in each of the "6Cs" we target through our programming: collaboration, creativity, communication, confidence, critical thinking, and coping skills. These new questions assess both self-efficacy specific to each C and general self-efficacy, as previous literature has shown self-efficacy in one domain transfers to self-efficacy in other domains (Urdan & Pajares, 2006).



41 of our summer 2019 Pathfinder Leadership Summit participants completed our new pre and post surveys. Here are some of those results.

This data indicates that Pathfinder participants showed statistically significant growth in self-efficacy for ALL 6Cs!
